He has vast experience designing and implementing transformative public health programs and interventions spanning Primary Health Care development, healthcare financing, immunization, nutrition, HIV/AIDS, MNCH, disease eradication, global health security, health systems leadership, and innovation.

Dr. Aina was until recently the Founder & CEO of Solina Centre for International Development and Research, where he served as Advisor to top leaders of several government agencies in Nigeria, including the Federal Ministry of Health, National

Primary Health Care Development Agency (NPHCDA), National Health Insurance Authority (NHIA), National Agency for the Control of AIDS (NACA), Federal Ministry of Finance, Federal Ministry of Industry, Trade and Investment, and several state governments. He was part of the national team that successfully eradicated WPV from Nigeria in 2020 and contributed immensely to the current drastic reduction in cases of cVPV2 in the last year.

Dr. Aina is passionate about realizing the vision of the NPHCDA, which is to make Primary Health Care services available to all in Nigeria.
